This beautiful weather has allowed our classes to be outside a lot more and teachers and students have definitely taken advantage of the current situation. All of our classes have been very excited to use our newly created outdoor classroom space nestled among the pine trees along the Sanderson Trail. Great Canadian Landscaping installed beautiful armour stones to be used as "tables and/or desks" for our students. We are very grateful to our School Council for providing the funds to make this happen. I would also like to acknowledge Michelle Schaefer, for the time she spent researching and designing the space for our new classroom. Our next step is to label the various species of trees that are found along the Sanderson Trail. We hope the students of Howick will treasure this space for many years to come.



If the weather does turn our school yard into a winter wonderland our students will be ready with new snow shovels and crazy carpets for our snow hill that were also purchased by our School Council. We look forward to getting the opportunity to use them. The year is going quickly and we are already starting to think about the next school year as we encourage families to register for kindergarten for the 2021-2022 school year. This year we will not be inviting prospective students to the school for the Calling All Three Year Old program; instead families are encouraged to register online. All of the classrooms took part in our Howick Bucket Challenge and they had a lot of fun inventing games and activities with basic 5 gallon pails. As the classes don't get the opportunity to see each other on the school yard now, Mrs. Haanstra created a video sharing what each class had done with their buckets. The students enjoyed seeing what each class had come up with. On Friday November 20th, the students will be able to participate in a school wide virtual assembly. The assembly is called Ned's Mindset Mission. The message of the assembly will focus on the following three themes: 1. Never Give Up: The Power of Yet 2. Encourage Others and 3. Do Your Best. During the virtual assembly the students will also get to see some yo-yo tricks as well. The new mathematics curriculum also focuses on the concept of growth mindset where students learn that it is okay to make mistakes as that is how we learn.

# Making A Difference During A Pandemic

Huron Respite Network, along with the families that they support, have taken the opportunity to show their gratitude for the respite providers who make a difference in people’s lives everyday. Respite providers give a break to parents or guardians who are full time caregivers of a child or adult with exceptional needs. Respite is a vital tool that provides time for caregivers to rejuvenate, heal and refresh. It is essential for boosting a caregiver’s ability to cope and is a powerful tool for keeping families together. In Huron County over 100 families are accessing respite, 15 of those families are in immediate need of respite providers. There are an additional 50 families on a waitlist for service. Very early in the pandemic, HRN shifted the way they provided service as meeting in person, for some, was no longer a viable option. Throughout the shut-down the agency continued to receive feedback from families regarding the pivotal role that respite providers play in their lives as school, summer camps and recreation activities were no longer possible.

In October HRN invited families to submit stories highlighting the impact that respite providers have on their lives. The stories were posted to social media under “Thankful Thursdays” and celebrated the selflessness of those who provide respite and emphasised the importance of the work. Respite providers all have their own unique gifts and talents that help to match them to the varied and unique needs of the families they support. Some provide support 2 – 3 hours a week and some invite a person into their home 1 weekend/month. Others choose respite as a career and work all week supporting

families and giving caregivers a break. The campaign’s goal is to recognize the selfless contributions of them all. Feedback for the project has been good and respite providers received a small token of appreciation and a meaningful letter from the families that they serve.

Huron Respite Network continues to plan for a time when restrictions are lifted and they can respond to families in need who may have been unable to continue with respite through Covid-19. Some will be in crisis. Some will have experienced even further social isolation exacerbating the physical and mental exhaustion of being the primary caregiver of a family member with a developmental or physical disability, autism or mental health concern. Many will be in need of someone in their life who can make a huge difference by giving a little of their time. 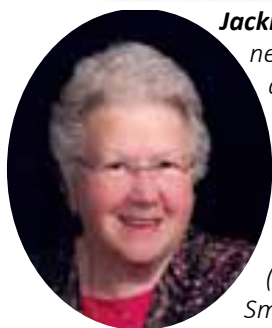
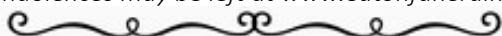

## Christmas Morning Apple Pie French Toast Casserole



### Ingredients

- 5 tablespoons butter
- 5 large granny smith apples  
approx. 8 cups peeled and sliced
- ⅔ cup brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon corn starch
- 14 slices white bread crusts removed
- 6 large eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 1 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract

### Instructions

- Combine eggs, milk and vanilla. Set aside.
- Peel & slice apples approximately ¼" thick.
- Melt the butter in a frying pan and add apples, brown sugar, cinnamon, and water. Cook on medium heat for about 8 minutes or until apples are slightly softened. In a separate bowl, combine 1 tablespoon corn starch and 1 tablespoon water to create a slurry.
- Push the apples over to one side of the pan, turn the heat up to medium high and pour some of the corn starch mixtures into the boiling liquid until it thickens. Depending on how much liquid was in your apples, you may not need all of the slurry.
- Spread apple mixture into a 9x13 pan. Top with ½ of the bread slices and spoon ½ of the egg mixture over the bread. Top with a second layer of bread slices and remaining egg mixture. Cover with foil and refrigerate overnight.
- In the Morning
- Remove the pan from the refrigerator while preheating the oven to 350°F.
- Bake covered for 35 minutes. Remove foil and bake an additional 10-15 minutes or until bread is firm. Remove from the oven and let cool 10 minutes. Invert into a pan.

**12 Days of Holiday FIRE and CO safety**

**12 TIPS OF HOLIDAY FIRE & CO SAFETY**

- 1 Water fresh trees daily.** Keep the base of the trunk in water at all times. Keep your tree away from any ignition source such as the fireplace, heaters or candles.
- 2 Check all lights before decorating.** Before you put up lights, check the cords closely. Discard any sets that are frayed or damaged. Never plug more than 3 strings of lights together. Never connect LED to conventional lights. This is likely to wear out LED bulbs more rapidly and could pose a fire or electrical hazard.
- 3 Make sure smoke alarms work, replace any over 10 years old.** It's the law to have working smoke alarms on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. Test alarms monthly and replace batteries once per year, or, choose "Worry-Free" models with 10-year sealed batteries that never need to be changed. Check the age of your smoke alarms - replace every 10 years.
- 4 Protect your family with carbon monoxide alarms:** It's the law in Ontario. If your home has an attached garage, wood or gas fireplace, or other fuel-burning device, you must have a working CO alarm outside every sleeping area. For optimal protection, install one on every storey. Like smoke alarms, CO alarms wear out. Check the age of your CO alarms and replace according to manufacturer's instructions.
- 5 Make sure everyone knows how to get out safely.** Develop and practice a home fire escape plan with everyone in your family, as well as your guests over the holidays. Once outside, stay outside and call 911 from a cell phone or neighbour's house. Determine who will be responsible for helping anyone who may need assistance.
- 6 Use extension cords wisely.** Avoid overloading circuits with plugs and extension cords, as this can create overheating that could result in fire. Never put cords under rugs.
- 7 Give space heaters space.** Keep them at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn such as curtains, upholstery, or holiday decorations.
- 8 Go flameless.** Avoid using real candles, opting instead for safer flameless candles. If you use real candles, remember to blow them out before leaving the room or going to bed. Keep lit candles safely away from children and pets and anything that can burn.
- 9 Keep matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children.** Matches and lighters can be deadly in the hands of children. If you smoke, have only one lighter or book of matches and keep it with you at all times.
- 10 Watch what you heat.** Always stay in the kitchen and pay attention to your cooking - especially if using oil or high temperatures. If a pot catches fire, carefully slide a light-colored lid over the pot to smother the flames and then turn off the heat.
- 11 Encourage smokers to smoke outside.** Careless smoking is the leading cause of fatal fires. Encourage smokers to smoke outside and use large, deep ashtrays that can't be knocked over. Make sure cigarette butts are properly extinguished.
- 12 There's more to responsible drinking than taking a cab home.** With all the festive cheer this time of year, keep a close eye on anyone attempting to cook or smoke while under the influence of alcohol. Alcohol is often a common factor in many fatal fires.




